FUNDAMENTALS OF OUR FAITH (WEEK 4)

READ SCRIPTURE: Jeremiah 9:23-24

KNOW THE BIG IDEA: THE ATTRIBUTES OF GOD TEACH US WHO WE WORSHIP, WHY WE WORSHIP, AND HOW TO WORSHIP.

DISCUSS

What stood out, challenged, or confused you about this week's message?

What would you say are the biggest challenges in studying theology?

Read Jeremiah 9:23-24

What does it take to know God?

Is knowing God mostly about knowledge --education/study? Explain.

Rto know God we must understand his attributes. This week we

studied God's incommunicable attributes --those attributes that only God can possess. Read through the list...

- Infinite: God is beyond any limits of time and space; He exists and acts in a way that is unlimited and boundless. (Revelation 1:8; 1 Kings 8:27)
- **Eternal:** God has no beginning or end; He exists forever, beyond the constraints of time. (Isaiah 57:15)
- **Self-existent (Aseity):** God depends on nothing outside of Himself for His existence; He is entirely self-sustaining. (John 5:26)
- **Self-sufficient:** God can act and accomplish His will independently; He doesn't need assistance or resources from anyone or anything. (Acts 17:24–25)
- **Immutable:** God never changes in His nature, will, or character; He remains constant and unchanging. (Psalm 102:25–27, Hebrews 13:8)
- **Omniscient:** God knows everything perfectly, past, present, and future; He has complete and perfect knowledge of all things. (Psalm 139:1–6, Job 37:16)
- **Omnipotent:** God is all-powerful; He can do anything and everything according to His will. (Job 42:2, Jeremiah 32:27)
- **Omnipresent:** God is everywhere at all times; His presence encompasses the totality of His character. (Proverbs 15:3, Jeremiah 23:23–24)
- **Sovereign:** God is entirely and supremely in control over all things; He rules and governs all of creation.

Which of these attributes are most relatable to you? Which ones are most difficult to understand?

How do these attributes help us love God more?

Ultimately, God is sovereign. In what situations in your life have you found comfort or guidance in the knowledge of God's sovereignty (being completely and supremely over all things)?

Can you share personal experiences or examples where understanding these attributes has deepened your relationship with God or impacted your worship practices?

How might these incommunicable attributes of God inspire awe, reverence, and humility in your worship and daily life?

Close with a prayer time for your faith journey and the journies of people in your family, small group, or friend circles.

Consider writing down prayer requests.

Pray specifically for...

areas where God is calling you, or your family or group, to be obedient to Jesus and for opportunities to share your freedom in Christ with others.

strength to be the church, to be urgent about the kingdom, and to follow Jesus without hesitation.

for God to reveal the next steps for His Kingdom and how to live in a way that pleases God.
