Saying we're sorry to God for our sins is called repentance. The word "repent" in the Greek literally means to "change your mind." So when we repent for our sins, we are saying sorry to God, and we are promising that, by His grace and with His help, we will make better choices. But even when we sin again, we need to understand that God loves us. He's our Heavenly Father, and He wants us to ask for forgiveness. Name something you need to ask God to forgive you for.
